DEAR DEDICATED PARTNERS, MEMBERS, AND FRIENDS,

It is our pleasure to share the Cybersecurity of Maryland, Inc.'s (CAMI) first annual Impact Report. The report highlights key results in fiscal year 2023.

Cybersecurity is a vital issue that affects companies, regardless of industry. To better meet growing needs, CAMI widened our membership qualifications in 2023 to companies across all verticals that view cybersecurity as a strategic initiative. In addition, we established three Centers of Excellence, leveraging our existing resources and activities with improved accessibility. These centers provide a forum to share best practices, empowering our members to further innovate and grow the cybersecurity ecosystem. Key activities from each center included:

The Center for Business Growth and Innovation collaborated with McKinsey and Company to publish a study on the strengths and needs of the mid-Atlantic region as a leading cybersecurity hub.

The Center for Cyber Resilience

strengthened our programming for our affiliate members, including state, local, and educational (SLED) organizations and the defense industrial base.

The Center for Talent Acquisition

secured a legislative win for the Cyber Maryland program. Administered by the Maryland Technology Development Corporation (TEDCO), the Cyber Maryland program will address the workforce needs of the cybersecurity industry in Maryland and to support the development of a highly skilled and diverse cybersecurity workforce.

In 2024, CAMI looks forward to continued work with the Maryland Department of Commerce and Maryland Small Business Development Center to implement a new 2023 program. Funded as a Cybersecurity for Small Business Pilot Program from the U.S. Small Business Administration, the Small Business Cybersecurity Resilience in Maryland (SCRIM) program will include training and direct services for 40 small businesses, helping them mitigate future cyber attacks through employee training and the installation of advanced software up to \$10,000 per business. We also look forward to growing our affiliate membership program and to building our speaker's bureau capacity to strengthen CAMI's representation in meetings and conferences.

AGILE CARE ENTERPRISES + CAMI = A CAPACITY BUILDING DREAM

For Tasha Vanzie, an expert in organizational design and development, CAMI's strength as a capacity-builder was clear from the start.

Agile Care Enterprises, a project management and healthcare IT company specializing in cybersecurity, builds the infrastructure their customers need to succeed. Founded and led by 29 -year decorated United States Naval Officer Lieutenant Commander Marion Vanzie (Ret)., Agile Care Enterprises prioritizes protecting healthcare records and national assets through partnerships with mid-sized to large government contracting companies and contracting directly with agencies like the Defense Health Agency, Veterans Administration, and others. The company was founded with a mission to serve the nation by employing veterans and building a pipeline of cybersecurity opportunities for younger generations through intentional STEM outreach and activities. Marion and Tasha Vanzie proudly identify Agile Care Enterprises as a family-owned business and demonstrate that entrepreneurship can be a sustainable model for families like theirs to transition their military expertise.

When it was time to select a location to start their business, Agile Care Enterprises chose Maryland due to the state's focus on cybersecurity, the collaborative business environment, proximity to family, and the presence of organizations like CAMI. Specifically, they chose the Cyber Incubator at bwtech@UMBC to be among people that deeply understand the start-up challenges and opportunities they are facing and the companies there possess a similar sense of commitment to R&D. Since joining CAMI in 2022, Agile Care Enterprises has leveraged CAMI's infrastructure and events to build relationships and collaborate with other companies. One program that has been instrumental in their growth is the CAMI Benefit Ecosystem, a suite of products with preferred rates, negotiated for the betterment of our employers and their employees. Example products include health insurance, 401K administration, disability/life insurance, payroll, and other unique offerings. Our Benefit Ecosystem helped Agile Care Enterprises establish a competitive benefits structure to attract top talent, enabling them to scale effectively despite being a small company, growing their staff by more than 400% in one year.

ADVOCACY

Our advocacy is most visible during the annual legislative session in Maryland, but we are active throughout the year to lead the advancement of cybersecurity. During the 2023 session, we partnered with the Alliance for Digital Innovation, the National Cryptologic Foundation, Maryland Association of Community Colleges, and TEDCO to advocate for the Cyber Maryland program. A key aspect of the program is ongoing research in collaboration with the CAMI Cybersecurity Talent Advisory Board to collect and analyze real-time industry data on cybersecurity workforce needs. Throughout the year, CAMI leaders served on the Modernize Maryland Commission, the Attorney General's Maryland Cybersecurity Council, and the Comptroller's Information Technology Work Group.

EDUCATION

Driven by our three Centers of Excellence, providing education and actionable resources is critical to our programming and mission. We curate events with our members on topics ranging from Gartner's cyber trends and leveraging local cyber training funds, to Cybersecurity Maturity Model Compliance (CMMC) guidance and maintaining a sensitive compartmented information facility (SCIF). As a resource for any organization who views cybersecurity as a strategic business initiative, CAMI maintains a robust online directory with products and services and a Speakers Bureau to identify a relevant subject matter expert for conferences or special programs. In 2023, we published the Mid-Atlantic Cybersecurity Buyer's Guide with the Baltimore Business Journal to share resources with their subscribers.


